

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Legacy Archival Material collection consists of various documents that have been donated, created, or purchased by the South End Historical Society since its creation in 1966. The material ranges from South End specific topics and institutions, such as Urban Renewal and the Boston Center for the Arts, to broader topics, such as U. S. History.

It is important to note that not all of the series headings relate specifically to topics, but may also be describing the form of the documents or record. For example, "Series I. Advertisements" and "Series XX. Newspapers and Magazines" are not about advertising or newspapers in the South End, but contain documents or records that are advertisements and newspaper clippings, respectively.

Overtime the material in this collection will change as staff, volunteers, and interns review material and re-process the material to better and more accurately describe it. Additionally, further acquisitions or material that is found in our collections will be added to this collection. Any revision to the material will be noted on the first page.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Since the South End Historical Society's establishment in 1966 it has been collecting and preserving material relating to the history of Boston's South End. In 2010, the Executive Director, a group of volunteers, and the Collections Committee began a project to inventory all of the special collections material that had been collected to make items easier to find.

As part of this process the Collections Committee determine what items to fulfilled the Society's mission. Anything that they deemed not a part of the SEHS institutional archives or not fulfilling SEHS's mission was disposed of. The information in the inventory report was internally cataloged in PastPerfect 4 for the Executive Director's reference.
